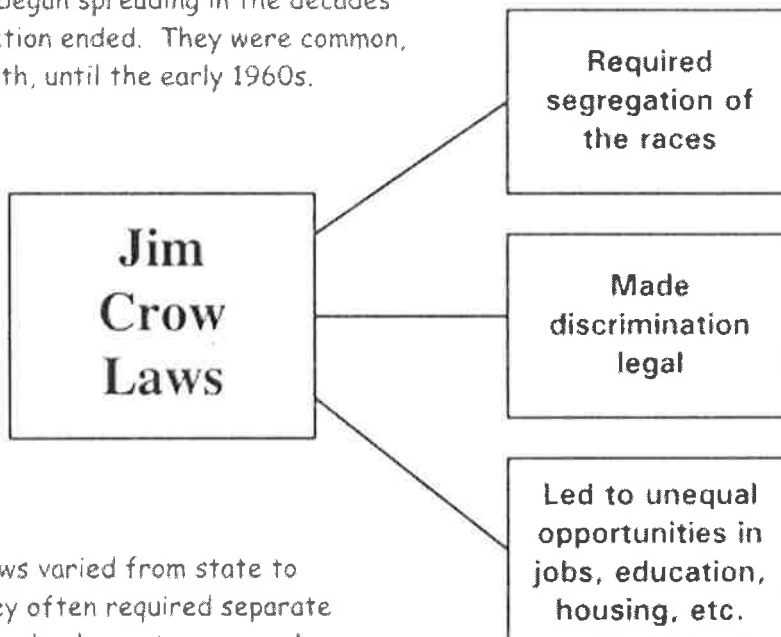


Jim Crow Laws – Defined with Graphic Organizers

Jim Crow laws began spreading in the decades after Reconstruction ended. They were common, mainly in the South, until the early 1960s.



Jim Crow laws varied from state to state, but they often required separate railroad cars, schools, restrooms, and drinking fountains for whites and blacks.
