Beginnings

Causes:

- Improved technology and industrialization fostered nationalism
- Unresolved previous disputes between countries. Mostly dealing with imperialism and colonial expansion

Africa and Asia

- The intricate system of alliances
- Delays and misunderstandings in diplomatic communications
- The <u>arms races</u> of the previous decades and increased militarism.

The Spark that Ignited the FLAME

Serbian Problem-Bosnia and Herzegovina had been occupied by Austria-Hungary in 1878 and annexed in 1908. Many Bosnians, particularly Bosnian Serbs, resented the occupation, preferring instead unification with Serbia. Russia Supported Serbians



Emperor William II- German emperor responded to the assassination with a blank check, saying that Austria-Hungary could rely on Germany's "Full Support", even if matters to the length of a was between Austria-Hungary and Russia.






The Spark that Ignited the FLAME

 - Many say that this started the "Great War"














Domino Effect Begins

Alliances:

- Austria Hungary threatens Serbia
- Russian treaties with Serbia commit it to mobilize in Serbia's defense
- Germany mobilizes against Russia due to the <u>Schlieffen Plan</u>
- France mobilizes after German Attack
- Britain's 1839 treaty with <u>Belgium</u> commits it to defend Belgium from all aggressors although how far Britain needed to adhere to this treaty is questionable; it is more likely that the decision was based more on the age-old concern to prevent a single power dominating the channel ports of the continent and also Asquith's need to hold his government together in the face of a largely pro-war House of Commons.
- With Britain's entry, the remainder of the <u>British Imperial</u> colonies and <u>dominions</u> are drawn in offering financial and military assistance. These were <u>Australia</u>, <u>Canada</u>, <u>India</u>, <u>New Zealand</u> and the <u>Union of South Africa</u>
- Japan, honoring its military agreement with Britain, declares war on Germany

Countries chose sides and formed into two alliances known as the "Allies" and the "Central Powers."
